Landowner Assistance Program

The coronavirus has changed life as we know it and will also have an impact on our Landowner Assistance Program. You are receiving the application in this mailing. Please complete it as best you can at this point and get it back to the office. We will more than likely not have distribution days like we have had. As it looks now you will need to set up an appointment to pick up your chemical. This will limit the number of people in the shop at one time. Your applications will need to be submitted before your appointment. Submit them shortly after receipt. Schedule your appointment later. We do not accept credit or debit cards so if you pay with cash please make sure you have the denominations you think you might need as we won't have change. Checks are preferable. Tordon is a restricted use product and will require certification to buy and or apply. If someone other than the person certified picks up the chemical you will need a completed authorization form which is also included in this mailing. Wholesale will be available at appointments.

Remember: application goes to office; pickup at shop by appointment

Notes:

- Manure and urine from animals consuming grass or hay treated with Milestone may contain enough product to cause injury to sensitive broadleaf plants.
- Hay from a Milestone treated area can only be used on the farm or ranch where product is applied.
- Wholesale herbicides available: Roundup, Freelexx, Opensight
- If we have received an NSF check from you, transactions will be on a cash only basis
- You may put your applications in the drop box at the Courthouse if the office at 1340 W Villard is closed. The drop box is located on the north side of the building—use the east entrance to the parking lot.
